



Here it is only a few days after the Change-of-Watch (CoW), and I am writing an article on what I expect to accomplish as the new Executive Officer (XO). For those of you that are not familiar with the officers/ committees/activities that fall under



the XO, I will list then with a very general description.

General Safety is usually thought of as the boating activities, but with COVID-19, the job has been expanded to take in meetings and all gatherings of members in any official capacity.

Marketing is the term we use to inform the public of news from the organization such as the CoW, educational classes being offered, free Vessel Safety Checks (VSC), and our fundraiser in January.

Ways and Means is a committee that tries to insure the squadron has the funds to support the mission of the organization.

Supply Officer oversees the squadron "Ship's Store". The store sells squadron shirts, sweaters, jackets, burgees, etc. to members to wear during those special times to display their membership.

Vessel Safety Check is a committee of dedicated individuals that perform the free safety checks on anyone's boat to ensure the boat is compliant with US Coast Guard rules and regulations.

Cooperative Charting is another activity the Club does free for the public. Volunteers go out in their own boats to check on the condition of the navigational markers. (Aids To Navigation – ATON)

As you can see, the activities deal with the safety of the community and less with the education or social aspects of the Club. The office of the XO is to assist these committees in performing their work for the good of Club's mission.

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER

P/D/C Ted Reiss, SN-CN

As the newly installed Squadron Educational Officer let's start the new year with a plan, a plan subject to change. My plan is to identify courses and seminars of interest we can conduct safely inperson based upon expressed interest and need from our members and availability of instructors. Since our classroom has seven six or eight foot tables



there is a limit per class of seven individual students or up to seven couples if each has their own table. No class will be mandatory and each member decides if the classroom procedures meet their comfort level for safety.

Currently there are three students taking Marine Navigation (Advanced Piloting) in the classroom. We check temperatures as they arrive, wear masks, use a hand cleaner, keep a distance from one another, keep the air purifier on and wipe up the tables and chairs after class. Each person has their own table.

Our first limited list (elsewhere in this newsletter and on web site) of courses and seminars contains titles, start dates, number of sessions, costs and instructors. Full descriptions of each are in the roster. For half of our members, the first course taken was Boat Handling (Seamanship). This full course contains six topics and a short test. However each of these topics can be taken as an individual seminar without a test by members wanting information on a select topic. Advanced registration is required due to our limitation on number of students. If more members are interested I will be glad to schedule additional dates.

As we proceed with concerns for Covid-19 and vaccines, changes, eliminations and additions are all possible. We have many other courses and seminars to offer. Some might even be free.

How many new boaters have used a boat simulator? We have one. Look for a specific date in March to try your hand at docking (while in the classroom).

Let me know how else the education department can help you.





SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer, S

An integral part of our squadron's Safety Program is the annual performance by member examiners of Vessel Safety Checks ("VSC"). These are performed on power vessels including jet skis and also paddle crafts such as kayaks. The VSC program is a dual initiative with the Coast Guard Auxiliary. The program is designed to make our waterways safer and ensure that vessel op-



erators are in compliance with current Coast Guard regulations. Club members performed about 150 inspections during the past year.

America's Boating Club Marco Island has about 10 certified examiners who will travel to your boat, whether at home or marina and spend about 30-45 minutes reviewing compliance issues and discussing appropriate recommendations.

The examination is facilitated when the vessel owner is prepared for the inspection by reviewing the contents of the form. Form 7012 may be found on our website or the Coast Guard Auxiliary website or an examiner may forward one ahead of time. Items to be checked include the following:

- Proper display of numbers
- Registration / documentation
- PFDs Life Jackets are they serviceable?
- Visual distress signals are flares current?
- Fire extinguishers are they operational?
- Ventilation of closed spaces
- Backfire flame control
- Sound producing device- whistle / horn / bell
- Navigation lights
- State requirements
- Overall vessel condition clean bilge / electric and fuel / cluttered deck and spaces

In my experience failures to pass the inspection, while infrequent, are usually the result of owners not checking ahead of time to ensure that lights are operating properly, or the flares are not in-date.

The basic inspection is straight forward but to me, a primary value of the exercise is in the discussion items which are a part of the form. This leads to a back-and-forth discussion of good, safe operating practices and I usually learn information valuable to me as a boat owner; could even be a fishing tip.

When the examiner finds your boat in compliance, he / she will sign the form, give the owner a copy, and award a sticker as shown below which is placed in a visible location on the left side of the vessel. Pass or fail, no information is passed on to authorities.

Now, for your free 2021 inspection, contact any of the inspectors listed in our current roster. Or, you may also go on to the USCGA website and highlight: *I Want a VSC*. Through the magic of the internet your contact information will be provided to the 5 closest examiners to your location, one of which will call you.

MARINE NAVIGATION (PILOTING) CLASS TO START ON 3/4

Marine Navigation (Piloting) is the first course in the sequence of USPS courses on navigation, covering the basics of coastal navigation. This course focuses on navigation for recreational boaters today and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool. The students will learn traditional techniques of navigation so the student can find his/her way even if their GPS fails. The course includes many in-class exercises, developing the student's skills through hands-on practice and learning. Eight—Ten classes of two hours each normally are scheduled for presentation of this course. Topics covered include:


- ⇒ Charts and their interpretation
- ⇒ Navigation aids and how they point to safe water.
- ⇒ Plotting courses and determining direction and distance
- ⇒ The mariner's compass and converting between True and Magnetic.
- ⇒ Pre-planning safe courses and entering them into the GPS.
- ⇒ Monitoring progress and determining position by both GPS and traditional techinquest such as bearings and dead reckoning

Classes meet on Thursday mornings starting March 4th at 9:00 am.
