

Boating Education Updates

For the past 100 years the United States Power Squadron has been providing nationally recognized education that helps people improve their boating skills,

become more confident, and have more fun.

Our Fall 2025 schedule of classroom courses begins this month.

Local classes

Starting October 27th Ted Reiss will teach *America's Boating Course (ABC)*. This course will provide you information you need to know to operate your boat safely and will provide those who successfully complete this course with a Florida Boating Safety Card.

You'll Learn:

- Information about your State Boating Laws, regulations, boat registration, and licensing
- Required boating safety equipment
- Do's and Don'ts of boating safely
- Practical Knowledge of navigation and rules of the road
- How to handle medical emergencies onboard and mechanical problems on the water
- The basics of towing and trailering

Beginning November 13th Nick Rago will teach the **Boat Handling** course. Our **Boat Handling** course (formerly Seamanship) is intended for recreational boaters who have completed **America's Boating Course** and want to gain more knowledge, skill, and confidence to boat safely and have more fun in a variety of situations. This course provides an indepth look at practical boating skills that build your competence and confidence on the water,

You'll learn:

- Rules of the road
- Confidence in docking, un-docking and slow speed maneuvering
- Handling your boat with confidence while underway
- Anchoring with assurance
- How to handle emergencies on board
- Knots and line handling that you need to know

Our courses and seminars had traditionally been offered solely in a classroom setting. However, recognizing the growing need, we've been working diligently to make more of our boating education content available to the members and the public through online courses, seminars, webinars and ondemand videos.

You now have complete flexibility in scheduling your education and learning in a way that suits you best. This includes:

- Classroom courses and seminars with knowledgeable, experienced instructors where you benefit from group interaction and, or
- Online resources that allow you to learn what you

want at your own pace and schedule

The purpose of this article is to bring you up to date with the learning resources you can now access online.

Online Boating Education:

You can now access a complete catalogue of online boating education resources by searching the following on your computer browser:

America's Boating Club Online Boating Classes

There you can find descriptions for all our online courses, seminars, and educational resources. Courses are comprehensive and in-depth while Seminars are focused 2-hour workshops on a variety of boating subjects. You also have access to a large library of free videos that cover a variety of boating topics. Mix and match these resources to suit your boating education needs. I will be happy to help guide you.

Virtual Classroom:

Here are a few of the online courses now being offered.

<u>America's Boating Course</u> - Learn boating basics at home or away with America's Boating Course. When followed by a test for state boating certification, our online course prepares you to get the Florida state boating card. As a bonus, you will receive a comprehensive, full-color, downloadable, 288-page course book.

<u>Boat Handling</u> - Our Boat Handling course (formerly Seamanship) is intended for recreational boaters who have completed America's Boating Course and want to gain more knowledge, skill, and confidence to boat safely and have more fun in a variety of situations.

<u>Marine Navigation</u>- Our Marine Navigation course gives you the skills you need to safely and confidently get to where you're going using charts and marine electronics.

<u>Weather</u> – Our Weather course is a detailed study of the causes of weather, various types of storms, clouds and predicting weather. You'll learn about meteorological systems, how weather is created and how to identify signs of impending poor or dangerous weather.

On-line Seminars:

I think the most exciting new change to the way we offer education is the growing list of seminars we are

offering online. Learn what you want when you want. Each seminar is approximately 2-hrs long. Here are just a few of the on-line seminars we offer: <u>Weather for Boaters</u> - Weather makes the difference between a great day and a lousy day on the water. Recognize and prepare for whatever weather comes your way. Learn to recognize the early signs of changing weather; how to anticipate storms, squalls, fog, and wind shifts; and become familiar with basic weather elements and how they affect your boating experience.

<u>Planning for Your Cruise</u> – Provides skills and knowledge for planning a successful cruise. Learn to choose the destinations, length, and season for your cruise as well as how to plan meals and provision your boat.

<u>All About Marine Radios</u> — Marine radios have many advantages over cell phones, especially in an emergency. Discover the different types of marine radios, what they can do for you, as well as how and when to use them.

<u>AIS Electronics for Boaters</u> — Automatic Identification Systems (AIS) Electronics for Boaters can help you navigate crowded waterways easily and safely.

With AIS marine electronics onboard, you can identify potential dangers and quickly make decisions on the water. Many systems share your boat's information with other boats so they can also make better, safer boating decisions.

In this course, you will learn what AIS does, how it works, whether you need an AIS system, how AIS is different from RADAR, how to use AIS to navigate more safely and what to consider when integrating AIS with your existing electronics.

<u>Crew at the Helm</u> - Are you a regular passenger on your family's or friend's boat? Looking to join your spouse on boating adventures? Learn the essential boating skills you need to operate a boat safely, respond in emergency situations and become a confident and valued crew member.

<u>Hurricane Preparation</u> - Learn how you can protect your boat from the ravages of wind, waves, torrential rain, tidal surge, and high water. You will learn how to develop a plan to protect your boat from a damaging storm.

On-line Boating Videos:

One of the most exciting new additions to our online education resource capability is <u>America's Boating</u> <u>ChannelTM</u>. It features free, on-demand safe boating videos and boater education digital media created especially for boaters, by boaters. There are currently videos on Navigation Rules, Boating Safety, Basic Skills, PWC Operation, Life Jackets, and Accident Reporting.

The library continues to grow. America's Boating Channel has grown from a few hundred on-demand boating safety and boater education videos to over 1,000 videos including a roster of boating themed entertainment videos: Boating News, Boat Fails, Boating Cartoons, Movies for Boaters, Military Films, Cooking on Board, Boat Races, and Boating TV programs. America's Boating Channel continues to carry out its mission as the first full-me television destination for all things boating!

SAFETY OFFICER Lt Geoff Fahringer, AP



Our Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron Executive Officer Chris Frost sent out some interesting information to our members recently. I found the information quite enlightening but, in some

cases, not that surprising. He was sharing information on boating accident statistics, and I wanted, with Chris's permission, to again share this information back out to all of you.

Boating Accident Review. Florida leads the nation with a total number of 1,030,053 registered vessels

in 2024. There were 685 reportable boating accidents in 2024.

Where cause of death was known, 76% of fatal boating incident victims drowned. The leading cause of death in fatal boating accidents was drowning with 37 fatalities (46%).

Where Personal Flotation Device usage was known, 87% were not wearing a Personal Flotation Device.

Where instruction was known, 69% of deaths occurred on boats where the operator did not receive boating safety instruction. Only 19% of deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had received a nationally approved boating safety education certificate.

Where length was known, 4 of every 5 boaters who drowned were aboard vessels less than 21 feet in length. 68% (57) of all vessels involved in fatal accidents in 2024 were 21 feet in length or less.

Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating incidents; where the primary cause was known, alcohol or drug-use is reported to have played a role in 36% of boating fatalities.

For reportable Boating Accidents, collision with fixed object was the leading type of accident with 41% of the fatal accidents resulted from collision with fixed objects. Towed watersport activities were involved in 7 accidents, resulting in 8 injuries. Paddle/Human powered craft (canoes, kayaks, rowboats, paddleboards) were involved in 10 accidents resulting in 9 fatalities. 82% (66) of the victims of fatal boating accidents were males. 64% of the operators involved in fatal accidents were aged 36 or older.

Let's look at those three topics: cause of death, use of flotation devices and education a little closer. Drowning is the leading cause of death when a boat accident occurs. Having recovered several victims from accidents on the water over the years, I can attest that the second topic is very pertinent. The drowning victims I recovered were NOT wearing a flotation device. And anyone of you who has lived here and spent time on the water has seen firsthand some of the numbskull behaviors and situations that uneducated and untrained boaters get into.

So, solutions? It's really pretty simple, you didn't start driving a car without training back in the day, why should boating be any different. A responsible boater, the owner or operator of ANY SIZE boat will

be educated on the rules of the road, know the waterway they are operating in, know the vessels that they are operating and have a boating plan that they adhere to every time. Our Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron has a pre-departure checklist that I use every time. Simple stuff, like know the weather, the tides and what the float plan is. Tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return. Make sure everyone knows where the life jackets are, the radio (yes, the VHF one not the stereo). Where is the anchor, the life jackets, signal devices, whistle, horn, fire extinguisher? You get it.

For a fun thing to do with your "crew" at some point during the day, practice man overboard drills. Toss a throwable cushion over the side and then have everyone take different roles to rescue the man overboard.

The power squadron promotes suddenly in command classes. Ask yourself, if you suddenly became incapacitated or fell overboard, can anyone else on your boat drive the boat?

Regarding life jackets. The power squadron recommends that everyone on the water should have a life vest on. The inflatable horse collar ones are not that expensive and are comfortable. At the very least consider having anyone who is not a strong swimmer or not that physically fit wear one.



Okay, I know it's not for everyone, so here is a realistic thought. Have those life jackets readily available, NOT on the bottom of the center console storage area under all that other junk. And make your plan the minute there is an issue, bad weather, boat problems, anything out of the ordinary, to make your FIRST move getting the life jackets on everyone. If things go south, and it quickly can, at least that

lifesaving tool is already in play. And if you're on your boat by yourself and you are not wearing a life jacket, well, I hope you have a plan on how your family will be provided for, because your irresponsible decision could affect more than your own life.

Taking a class and getting training is just smart. Our Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron has a wide range of classes. Go online, sign up and take some! www.marcoboatingclub.org/boating-courses is the link for our Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron page. I will be doing a CPR/AED First Aid class there on Saturday morning October 18th. Sign up and come in to learn how to save a life!

I have always thought how could I even live with myself if my lack of knowledge, lack of training and frankly just being negligent in my actions resulted in the loss of life being my fault. In 2024 there were 81 boating accidents in Florida, ask yourself why and commit yourself to being a safer boater.
