BOAT HANDLING

This is an all-new course that replaces a previous course, *Seamanship*. Boat Handling covers the following six areas, each of which is also taught as a seminar:

- Nautical Rules of the Road A Practical Approach
 - Understand the rules encountered by recreational boaters during most every boating outing.
 - Understand the rules most likely to apply in the local waters where they boat
- Confidence in Docking and Undocking Slow-Speed Maneuvering
 - Understand the issues affecting docking and undocking and how to deal with them
 - Understand how to use and know how to tie the two knots most often used when docking: the cleat hitch and the round turn and two half hitches
 - Understand how and when to use lines for docking and undocking.
- Boating with Confidence Handling Your Boat Underway
 - Understand the issues they can control on their boat such as steering, trimming, and planning and how to deal with them
 - Understand the issues that the environment will present to recreational boaters: wind, tides, weather, seas, inlets and how to handle them
 - Understand how to use and know how to tie the two knots most often used when at sea: the sheet bend and the bowline.
- Anchoring with Assurance Don't Get Carried Away
 - o Understand how to anchor and choose appropriate locations depending on conditions
 - \circ $\;$ Understand how to select appropriate anchors, chain and rode
 - Understand how to effectively pick up moorings and raft their boat to other boats.
 - Understand how to use and know how to tie the two knots most often used when anchoring: the anchor bend and the figure-eight knot.
- Emergencies on Board Preparation for Handling Common Problems
 - Understand the most common types of vessel emergencies and how to deal with them.
 - Understand medical emergencies and how to be prepared for them.
- Knots and Line Handling The Knots You Need to Know
 - Know the function of knots, bends, and hitches most often used on recreational vessels
 - Know the characteristics and properties of rope used to make various types of line used on recreational vessels
 - Understand how the characteristics and properties of the rope affect the performance of line for various functions on recreational vessels
 - Know how to select the proper type and size of line for use on their boat
 - Know how to care for the lines used on their boat. B. Skills to Be Developed
 - Be able to correctly tie the knots, bends, and hitches most often used on recreational vessels
 - Be able to coil a line for proper storage.
